IOWA DENTAL BOARD COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

The Iowa Dental Board is seeking applicants for consideration to the following committees. Committee appointments will be made at the June 7, 2019 meeting. Interested parties should submit a letter of interest and CV or resume to the Board no later than May 17, 2019. You may forward the request for consideration to the Board office at IDB@iowa.gov.

Anesthesia Credentials Committee (ACC): The ACC is tasked with reviewing requests related to the issuance and renewal of moderate sedation permits and general anesthesia permits. On occasion, the Board may ask the committee to weigh in on sedation-related matters.

Membership: Members of the committee must be licensed dentists. At least four committee members must hold a moderate sedation or general anesthesia permit.

Time Commitment: The committee meets approximately six times a year. Most meetings are conducted via teleconference.

Continuing Education Advisory Committee (CEAC): The CEAC is tasked with reviewing and making recommendations to the Board on requests for continuing education course and sponsor requests. The committee also discusses continuing education related issues at the request of the Board.

Membership: Committee membership must consist of the following:

- One member of the Iowa Dental Board;
- Two licensed dentists with expertise in the area of professional continuing education;
- Two licensed dental hygienists with expertise in the area of professional continuing education; and
- Two licensed dental assistants with expertise in the area of professional continuing education.

Time Commitment: The committee meets approximately six times a year. Most meetings are conducted via teleconference.

Iowa Practitioner Review Committee (IPRC): The IPRC evaluates, assists and monitors the recovery or rehabilitation of dentists, dental hygienists, and dental assistants who self-report possible impairments. The goal of the program is to support practitioners who seek the program's assistance and to protect the public by carefully monitoring practitioners with diagnosed impairments that may affect their ability to practice. The IPRC designs an individualized recovery or rehabilitation program to meet the specific needs of the licensee; and providing ongoing monitoring and guidance.

Membership: Committee membership may consist of, but is not limited to:

- Executive director of the Iowa Dental Board or designee from Board staff;
- One practitioner who has remained free of addiction for no less than two years following successful completion of a Board-approved recovery program, a Board-ordered probation for drug or alcohol dependency, addiction, or abuse, or an IPRC contract;
- One physician/counselor with expertise in substance abuse/addiction treatment programs;
- One psychiatrist or one psychologist; and
- One public member.

Time Commitment: The committee meets once a quarter at the Board offices. On occasion, teleconferences may be scheduled to deal with urgent matters.
